



Under Section 179 and 168k, significant tax savings can be derived as a breeder of livestock. Exotic wildlife are deemed to be livestock. Therefore, when purchasing exotic wildlife for the purpose of breeding, the purchaser may deduct 100% of purchase price as well as all costs associated with the care of these animals in the year of acquisition. The current maximum deduction in one year is limited to \$2,500,000. If however, you exceed this amount, you may use section 168k (Bonus Depreciation) to deduct any excess.

If you intend to be, or are a breeder of exotic wildlife, all purchases made today are able to be deducted in full for the tax year.

SABLE ANTELOPES



Sable antelopes are known for their impressive horns, which curve backward and can reach lengths of up to 65 inches. Primarily grazers, Sabes feed on grasses, leaves, and other vegetation. They are known to be selective in their foraging habits, often choosing high- quality grasses. Adult males (bulls) are larger and more heavily built than females (cows). Bulls can weigh between 1,100 to 1,300 pounds and stand about 47 to 55 inches tall at the shoulder. Cows are slightly smaller.

NILGAI

Nilgai are the largest Asian antelope species, with males typically larger than females. They have a bluish-gray coat, with males having a bluish gray to bluish-black coloration and females being more brownish. They also have white markings on their face, throat, and legs. Nilgai are found in a variety of habitats, including grasslands, forests, and scrublands. They are well-adapted to arid and semi-arid regions. Nilgai are known for their cautious and alert nature. They are typically seen in small groups, and they are diurnal, meaning they are active during the day.



MUNTJACS DEER



Muntjacs, also known as barking deer or Mastreani deer, are a group of small to medium- sized deer species found in Asia. They are known for their distinctive barking vocalizations. Muntjacs are relatively small deer, with a height ranging from about 18 to 26 inches (45 to 65 cm) at the shoulder. Males typically have small, unbranched antlers, while females do not have antlers. They have large, rounded eyes and long, sharp canine teeth, which are particularly pronounced in males. They are adaptable and can thrive in both tropical and temperate environments.

FALLOW BUCKS



Fallow Bucks are available year-round and thrive in various climates. They come in a wide variety of colors including dark brown, spotted brown and pure white. With their unique palm like antlers, they have quickly grown in popularity and come available as stocker bucks or high pedigrees.

AXIS DEER

The chital or cheetal also known as the spotted deer, chital deer and axis deer, is a <u>deer species</u> native to the <u>Indian subcontinent</u>. A moderate-sized deer, male chital reach 90 cm (35 in) and females 70 cm (28 in) at the shoulder. While males weigh 70–90 kg (150–200 lb), females weigh around 40–60 kg (88–132 lb). It is <u>sexually dimorphic</u>; males are larger than females, and <u>antlers</u> are present only on males. The upper parts are golden to rufous, completely covered in white spots. The abdomen, <u>rump</u>, throat, insides of legs, ears, and tail are all white. The antlers, three-pronged, are nearly (3 ft 3 in) long



RED KANGAROO



The Red Kangaroo is a large kangaroo with a body length of up to I.4m and tail up to Im. Males tend to be orange red in colouring while females are often blue grey. Both males and females are a lighter whitish colour underneath. Red Kangaroos can be distinguished from other species of kangaroos by the black and white patches on their cheeks and the broad white stripe that extends from the corner of the mouth to ear. Male Red Kangaroos are double the body weight of females and can weigh up to 92kg while the females can weigh up to 39kg.

SCIMITAR ORYX





The scimitar oryx (Oryx dammah), also known as the scimitar-horned oryx and the Sahara oryx, is an Oryx species that was once widespread across North Africa. In 2000, it was declared extinct in the wild on the IUCN Red List. This particular oryx is adapted to harsh desert conditions and can survive for months or even years without drinking water. A grazing animal, it derives most of its daily moisture intake from plants.

EUROPEAN FALLOW DEER



The European fallow deer (Dama dama), also known as the common fallow deer or simply fallow deer, is a species of ruminant mammal belonging to the family Cervidae. It is historically native to Turkey and possibly the Italian Peninsula, Balkan Peninsula, and the island of Rhodes in Europe. Prehistorically native[2] to and introduced into a larger portion of Europe, it has also been introduced to other regions in the world.

PÈRE DAVID'S DEER



The Père David's deer (Elaphurus davidianus), also known as the milu (Chinese: 康度; pinyin: mílù) or elaphure, is a species of deer native to the subtropical river valleys of China. It grazes mainly on grass and aquatic plants. It is the only extant member of the genus Elaphurus. Some experts suggest demoting Elaphurus to a subgenus of Cervus.[2] Based on genetic comparisons, Père David's deer is closely related to Eld's deer. The Père David's deer is endemic to the Chinese region. According to fossil records, the species first appeared during the Pleistocene period, when it could be found across Manchuria

AOUDAD SHEEP

The Aoudad sheep, also known as Barbary sheep, is a species of Caprine native to Rocky Mountains in North Africa. They can get up to 7 feet tall and can weigh up to 320 lbs. Their horns have a triangular cross section. The horns curve outward, backward, then inward and can exceed up to 30 inches. Aoudad are found in mountainous areas where they can graze and browse grasses and bushes. They are active in the Aoudad is rare in North Africa but has been introduced to North America and Southern Europe.



BLACK HAWAIIAN SHEEP



There is some controversy on how the Black Hawaiian breed was started. Some say it is a cross of Mouflon and black hair sheep from the Hawaiian islands. Others say they are Barbados with a dilution of the red color gene making them black. The color of the ram is black with many rams having a little white on the muzzle around the nose and sometimes having an outer coat of reddish wool. The horns are usually dark and grow up, back, down, forward, up, and out. There are fewer Black Hawaiian rams than the other sheep species. They often have a thick, nice beard on their neck.

AMERICAN BISON



The European bison (pl: bison) (Bison bonasus) or the European wood bison, also known as the wisent, or sometimes colloquially as the European buffalo,[c] is a European <u>species</u> of <u>bison</u>. It is one of two extant species of bison, alongside the <u>American bison</u>. The European bison is the heaviest wild <u>land animal</u> in <u>Europe</u>, and individuals in the past may have been even larger than their modern-day descendants. During the early years of the 20th century, bison were hunted to <u>extinction in the wild</u>.

CAPE BUFFALO

The African buffalo (Syncerus caffer) is a large sub-Saharan African bovine.[2] There are five subspecies that are recognized as being valid. Syncerus caffer caffer, the Cape buffalo, is the nominotypical subspecies, and the largest one, found in Southern Africa and East Africa. S. c. nanus (the forest buffalo) is the smallest subspecies, common in forest areas of Central Africa and West Africa, while S. c. brachyceros is in West Africa and S. c. aequinoctialis is in the savannas of East Africa. The adult African buffalo's horns are its characteristic feature: they have fused bases, forming a continuous bone shield across the top of the head, referred to as a "boss".



WATER BUFFALO



The water buffalo (Bubalus bubalis), also called the domestic water buffalo or Asian water buffalo, is a large <u>bovid</u> originating in the <u>Indian subcontinent</u> and Southeast Asia. Today, it is also found in Italy, the <u>Balkans</u>, Australia, North America, South America and some African countries.[I] Two extant <u>types</u> of water buffalo are recognized, based on <u>morphological</u> and <u>behavioural</u> criteria: the river buffalo of the Indian subcontinent and further west to the <u>Balkans</u>, <u>Egypt</u> and Italy and the swamp buffalo, found from <u>Assam</u> in the west through Southeast Asia to the <u>Yangtze</u> valley of China in the east.

BONGO



The bongo (Tragelaphus eurycerus) is a large, mostly nocturnal, forest-dwelling antelope, native to sub-Saharan Africa. Bongos are characterised by a striking reddish-brown coat, black and white markings, white-yellow stripes and long slightly spiralled horns. It is the only tragelaphid in which both sexes have horns. Bongos have a complex social interaction and are found in African dense forest mosaics. They are the third-largest antelope in the world

SOUTHERN ELAND

The common eland (Taurotragus oryx), also known as the southern eland or eland antelope, is a large-sized savannah and plains antelope found in East and Southern Africa. It is a species of the family Bovidae and genus Taurotragus. An adult male is around I.6 m (5.2 ft) tall at the shoulder (females are 20 cm (7.9 in) shorter) and can weigh up to 942 kg (2,077 lb) with a typical range of 500-600 kg (I,I00-I,300 lb), 340-445 kg (750-98I lb) for females). It is the second-largest antelope in the world, being slightly smaller on average than the giant eland.[3] It was scientifically described by Peter Simon Pallas in I766.



NYALA



The lowland nyala or simply nyala (Tragelaphus angasii), [3] is a spiral-horned antelope native to southern Africa. It is a species of the family Bovidae and genus Tragelaphus, previously placed in genus Nyala. It was first described in 1849 by George French Angas. The body length is 135–195 cm (53–77 in), and it weighs 55–140 kg (121–309 lb). The coat is maroon or rufous brown in females and juveniles, but grows a dark brown or slate grey, often tinged with blue, in adult males. Females and young males have ten or more white stripes on their sides. Only males have horns, 60–83 cm (24–33 in) long and yellow-tipped. It exhibits the highest sexual dimorphism among the spiral-horned antelopes. It is not to be confused with the endangered mountain nyala living in the Bale region of Ethiopia.

ZEBRA



Zebras are African equines with distinctive black-and-white striped coats. There are three living species: the Grévy's zebra, plains zebra, and the mountain zebra. Zebras share the genus Equus with horses and asses, the three groups being the only living members of the family Equidae.

GIRAFFE

The giraffe is a large African <u>hoofed mammal</u> belonging to the genus Giraffa. It is the <u>tallest</u> living terrestrial animal and the largest <u>ruminant</u> on Earth. Traditionally, giraffes were thought to be one <u>species</u>, <u>Giraffa camelopardalis</u>, with nine <u>subspecies</u>. Most recently, researchers proposed dividing them into up to eight <u>extant</u> species due to new research into their <u>mitochondrial</u> and <u>nuclear DNA</u>, as well as morphological measurements. Seven other extinct species of Giraffa are known from the fossil record.






